

Save the Date: Tochak McGrath Discovery Reburial Ceremony, June 15



More than 10 years ago, a significant historical and cultural discovery was made on MTNT land in the center of McGrath, named the Tochak McGrath Discovery. Tochak (pronounced Ta-check) is a place name that refers to the confluence of the Takotna and Kuskokwim Rivers near McGrath and is named in reference to a traditional trading place long ago.

In October 2012, while clearing MTNT land for a local river levee construction project, workers noticed that a human skeleton had been exposed evidence quickly emerged that the remains preceded modern times. As the forensic archeologist carefully unearthed the remains, three individuals were found together with a couple of pieces of stone tools. After the initial recovery, archaeologists led by Bob Sattler with Tanana Chiefs Conference researched further to better understand the discovery site and the surrounding area. They found remains of subsistence camps in

before and a century after the time when bones of whitefish and burbot, bear, the people perished. The Tochak family rabbit, martin, dog, beaver and possibly remains represent an adult male, a younger adult male and a child between the age of two and five years of age.

Through an agreement with MTNT and the McGrath Native Village Council, the remains and artifacts were transferred to Tanana Chiefs Conference (TCC) for further study after proper funerary ceremonies for spiritual protection were conducted that year. Ancient DNA studies were completed and determined that they are all related to one another. The human remains are dated between 300-400 years ago and the archaeological layers of older and younger subsistence camps are dated to around 300, 400 and 500 years ago.

During the past few years while studies were being conducted, students from the McGrath School have been able to work alongside TCC archeologists continuing excavation of the subsistence camps to learn about pre-modern human history. The field school sessions have incorporated archeological research into the science curriculum at the McGrath School. During those science studies, students have discovered additional artifacts including volcanic glass sourced to a location on the Upper Koyukuk River, pieces of cooking pottery, a couple of small sewing tools to puncture hides,

deep flooding sediments about a century and an assortment of discarded animal porcupine. All of these remains confirm the true subsistence lifestyle of ancestors in the Upper Kuskokwim area.
